*In your search for mustard, you've somehow found yourself at Mr. Boddy's dinner party. Guests arrived at 6PM, and they stayed until 10PM. To everyone's shock and horror except yours, Mr. Boddy was killed at 8PM. There's some information recorded about where everyone was during the night, and we hope you can **flag** anything important you notice.* (The two answers are each 6 letters long.)

Every room but the Lounge was visited by at least 2 different people.

The culprit was in the place where Mr. Boddy was killed from 7-9PM.

The Study and the Ballroom were closed from 6-7 PM and 8-9 PM.

Mr. Green and Prof. Plum saw each other in the Hall.

Mr. Green and Ms. Peacock saw each other in the Study.

None of the other guests saw the culprit before Boddy's death.

A pair of people who were already together walked in on the culprit, immediately after the murder.

Ms. Peacock danced with Prof. Plum in the Ballroom for one hour. Ms. Scarlett danced with Colonel Mustard in the Ballroom at a different hour. Nobody else entered the Ballroom.

Ms. Scarlett and Mr. Green stayed together in the same place during the hour immediately before and after the body was found. No one else ever visited that place, and they never saw each other or entered that room otherwise.

The room in which the most cumulative time was spent (across all guests) was the Library with 5 hours.

Colonel Mustard heard the culprit talking to Mr. Boddy in a directly (non-diagonally) adjacent room.

Mrs. White left a note for Prof. Plum in the Kitchen, before the murder. Prof. Plum collected the note after the murder.

Whenever someone was in the Kitchen, someone else was in the Dining Room, and vice versa. No more than one person entered either room at once.

Colonel Mustard was the only one to visit the scene of the crime before the culprit.

Colonel Mustard, nervous for his upcoming dance, paced alone in the Hall from 8-9PM. Ms. Peacock waited before her dance in the Lounge.

Oh no! You spilled your tortilla chips everywhere and now need to reconstruct them into various three-dimensional shapes before you can enjoy your guacamole!

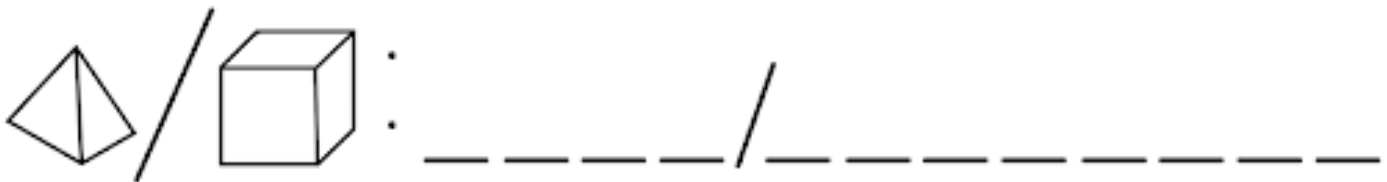
Luckily, your chips come with conveniently numbered edges. You can only place two chips next to each other along an edge if both chips share the same number on that edge.

Make sure you think about both shapes shown below!

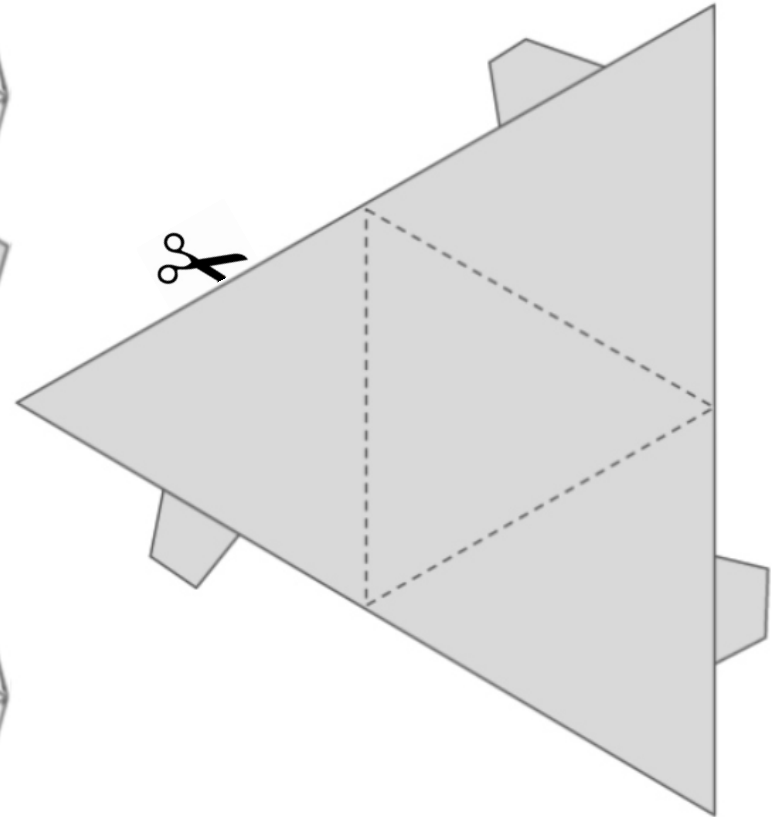
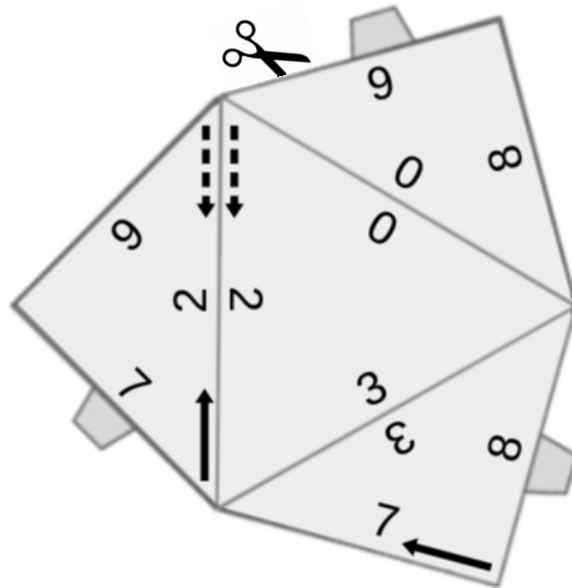
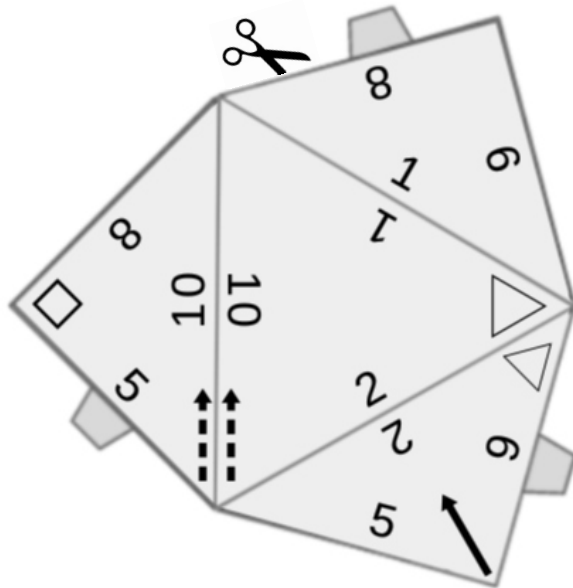
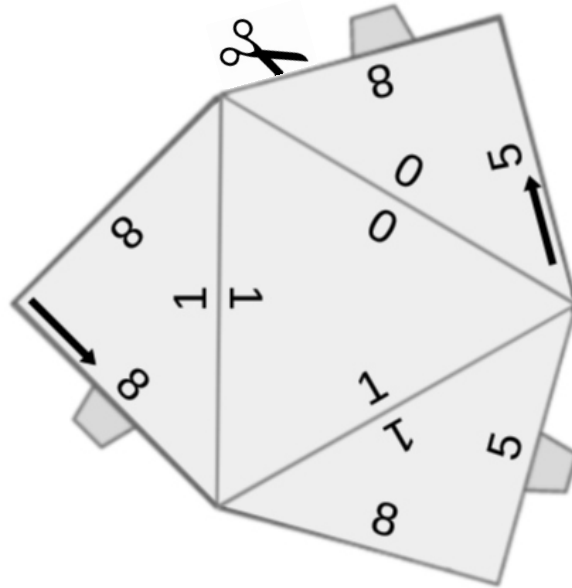
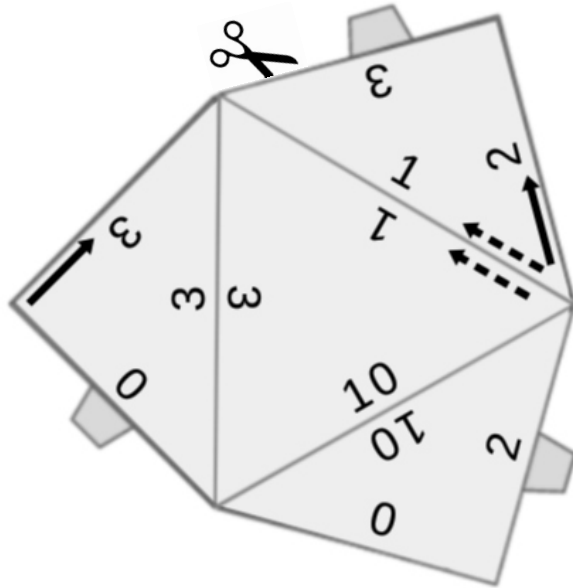

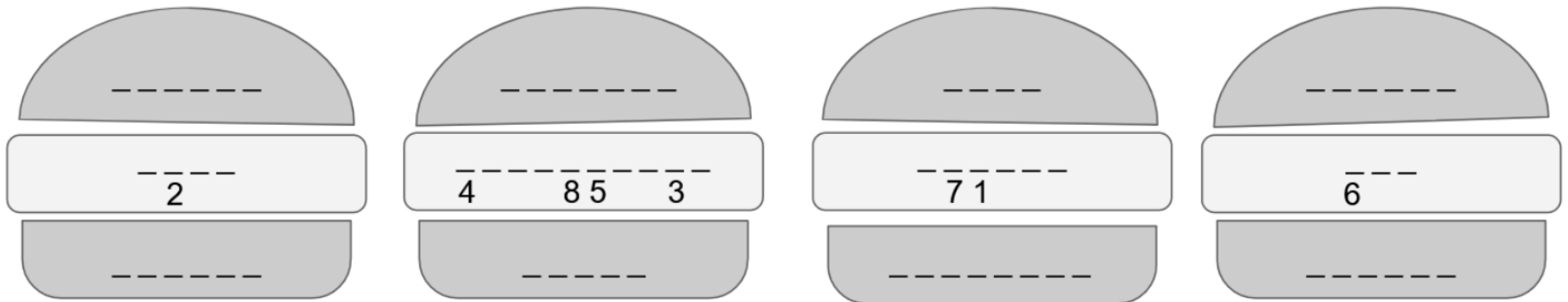




PUTTING IT TOGETHER



You've enjoyed finding the condiments, but now it's time to put them on your food. But which condiment goes on which burger? And remember to thoroughly slather both sides of the bun with your condiment!



Now that your burgers have been appropriately decorated, the condiments have a request. What do they ask you to do?



Oh no! You almost forgot to season your burgers before eating them!

To make matters worse, you've recently adopted a needlessly complicated scientific approach to seasoning things. Before seasoning anything, you divide it into a 5-by-3 grid and rate each sector of this grid by its tastiness (assigning it a number between 0 and 4). You then meticulously season each sector of the grid with salt or pepper in accordance with the following rules:

- Each sector must be seasoned with either salt or pepper, but not both.
- If a sector with rating n contains pepper, exactly n of its horizontally and vertically adjacent sectors must contain salt.
- If a sector with rating n contains salt, exactly n of its horizontally adjacent sectors must contain pepper.

Season all your food quickly before it gets cold!
