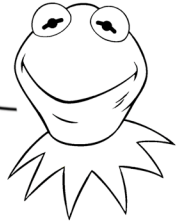


It's The Muppet Show, starring...?

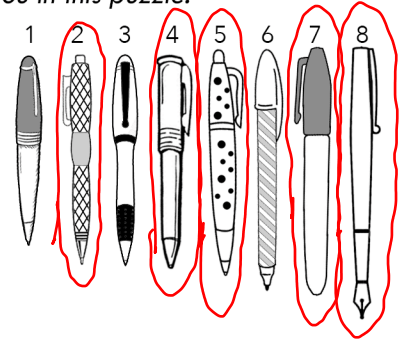
Piiiiigs Iiiiiin Spaaaaace

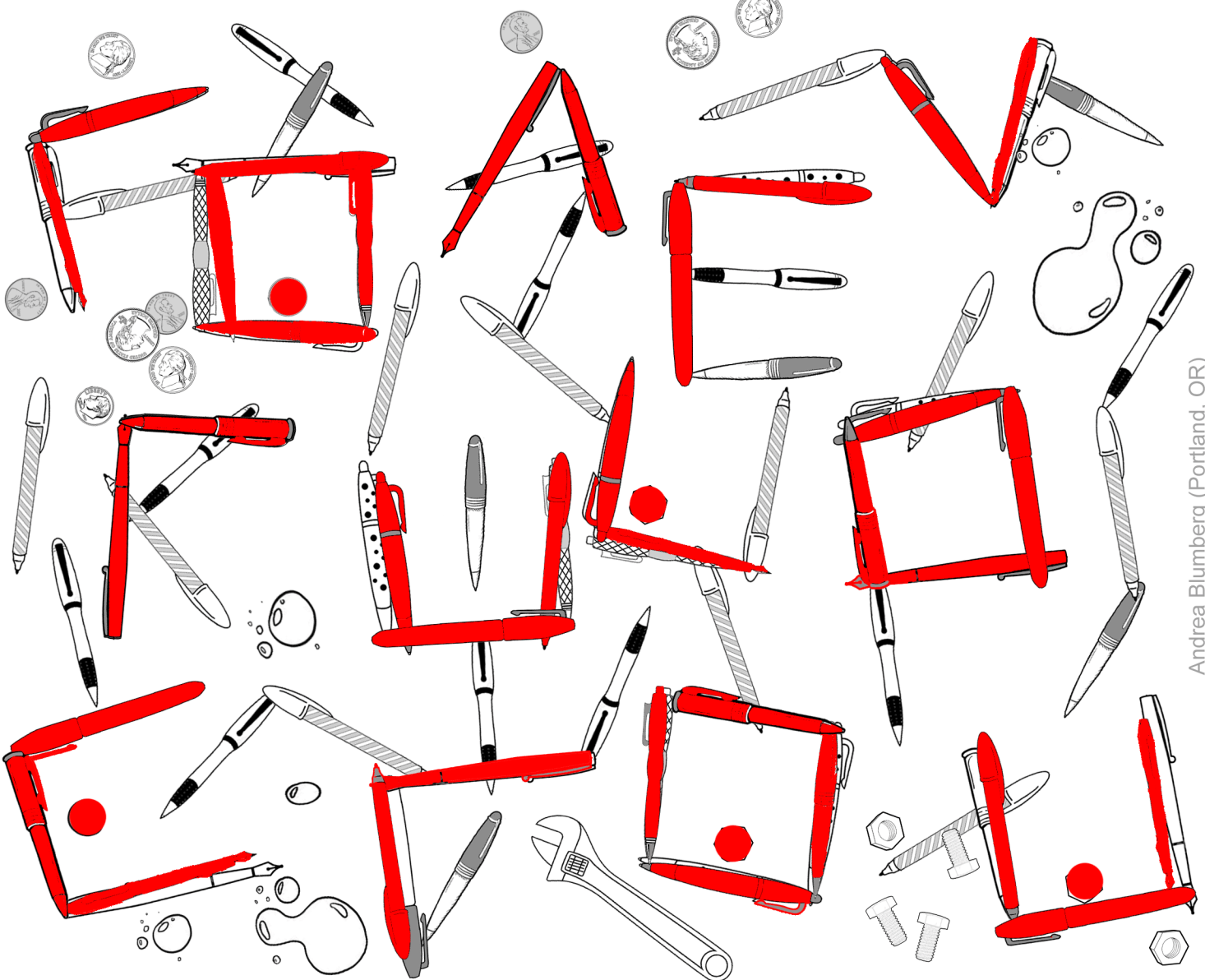

When you figure out which are which, shade in the space pens completely below, along with the appropriate floating debris. Your code sheet will be of help to you in this puzzle.

- Either the longest or the shortest pen is a space pen, but not both
- Only one of the space pens has a dark top
- There is an odd number of regular pens
- #4 is a space pen
- No regular pen is next to another regular pen
- Only two regular pens are labelled with an odd number
- Either #5 or #6 is a regular pen
- The longest space pen is directly to the right of a dark-topped pen.

The way this game of chicken works is that both sides come at each other head on. If one side "gives," then it will donate a letter to the other word, both of them making new words. If neither side "gives," then both words crash together and jumble up, and one letter will pop out of the wreckage, leaving a new word behind. You have to figure out which outcome happens each time. The middle clue is either a two-word clue for the "crash" word, or two one-word clues for each new "give" word. Keep track of the letter that either moves across or pops out and read them, in order, for the answer.

Each monitor represents one of the sub puzzles. Find the monitor words on the puzzle pages, and connect them, in order, to spell out a letter on each puzzle page. Arrange the puzzle pages in the order of Animal eating the Puzzled Pint glass to spell out RINGO.



Then connect the stars labelled STARR, DRUMMER and BEATLES, to get a "ring o' stars" that reads: "CONSTELLATION PRIZE."
