

Rhyme Scheme describes the sounds at the ends of lines of a poem. Starting with A, each new sound that ends a line is given a subsequent letter, as in the examples below.

A Twinkle twinkle, little **star**

A Mary had a little **lamb**

A How I wonder what you **are**

B With fleece as white as **snow**

B Up above the world so **high**

C And everywhere that Mary **went**

B Like a diamond in the **sky**

B The lamb was sure to **go**

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
