Each paired clue refers to compound words that end in LIGHT and HOUSE. The back half of the compound words are represented by a light bulb and a house emoji, respectively. Each pair has at least one letter in common, which fit into one of the 15 mini grids. The intersecting letters spell, in order, SMOKE AND MIRRORS.

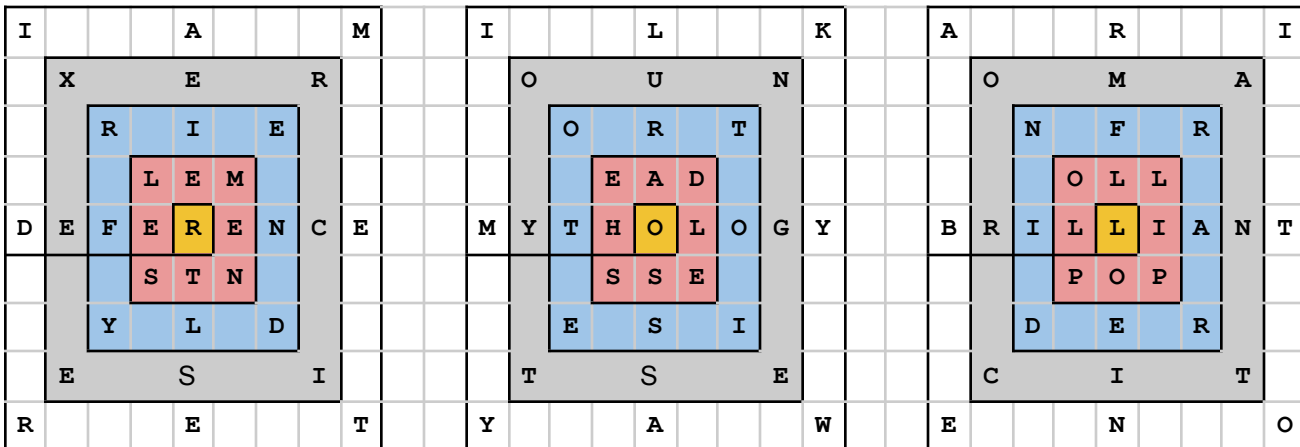
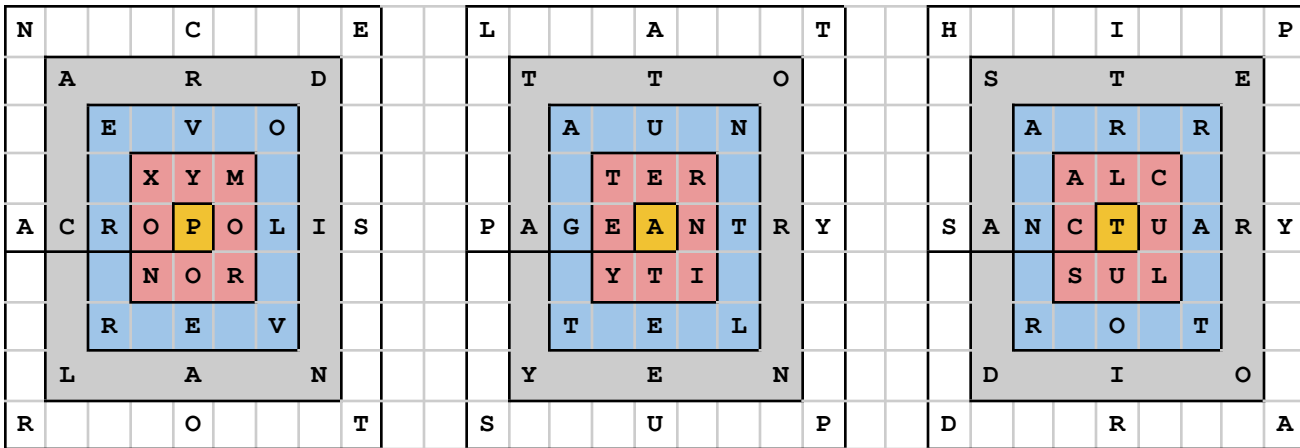

ARTIMIS SOLUTION

Answer: **PATROL**

Each set of four clues correspond to four eight-letter words circling each target from the outside ring going in, as illustrated by the first answer, given as AGNOSTIC.

When a set of words is written into a target, a nearly complete nine-letter word is revealed across it. The bull's-eye contains the missing middle letter; first, the "P" in ACRO_OLIS, then the "A" in PAGE_NTRY, and so on. Once all six targets are complete, the six "bull's-eye" letters spell out the answer, PATROL.

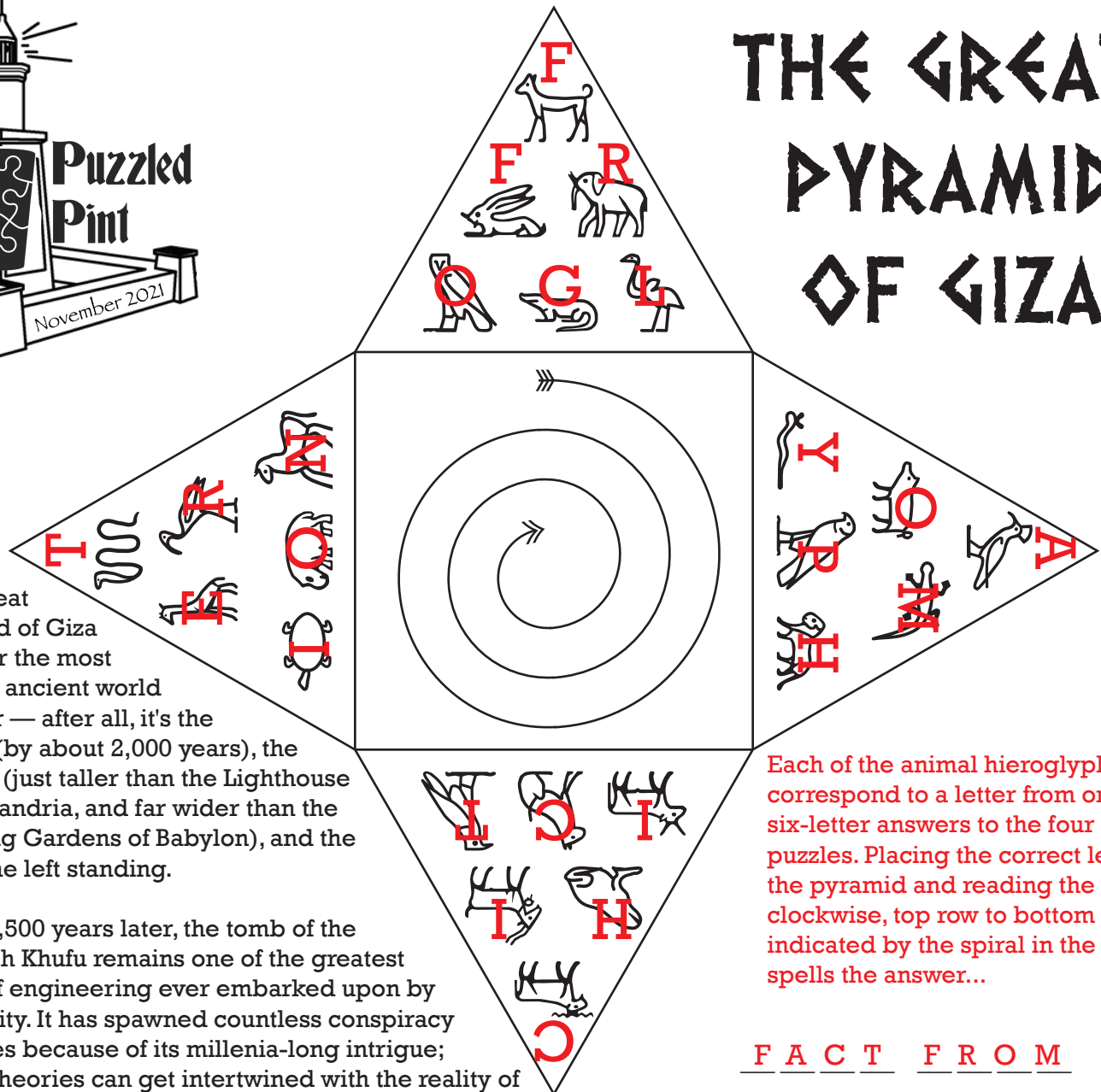

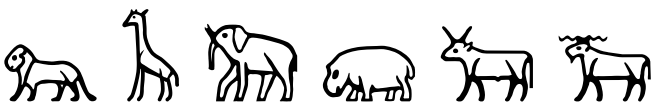
