

Choir Rehearsal

Here is your music for Tuesday's choir rehearsal. Music is read from left to right, just like regular text. However, remember that a good choir singer *reads all four lines together as a group from left to right*.

You must *b sharp* to pick out the correct notes and **connect the dots in the music**. Whatever you do, don't give up! Play on! Those three words of "I Love You" are magical, but The Bard came up with **four words** describing what music is that are also memorable! (This puzzle can be solved without note reading, however it provides an extra clue. See the music tip sheet or an online resource as needed.)

Tenor

Bass
