# **Hints**

## **49-Ring Circus**

- Consider the outtakes not as individual pieces but as sets of three.
- The word "signaled" in the flavortext is significant
- Trace the path of each trio of pieces, then use semaphore.

## The Ring

- An R is in every answer, and will thus be in the center of the grid.
- The three-letter ring next to the center contains the letters A, O, and S, in some order.
- As you complete the grid, you will spell a message around the perimeter, starting at 1.

#### **Pie Charts**

- You'll need to take the given percentage of each word.
- The four sections may not add up to 100%, but they do add up to one of the images on the second page... plus a little something extra.
- Bonus hint for our non-US solvers: In the states, those orange fruits are called tangerines.

## **Coins**

- The easiest place to begin is by placing the five dollar coins—there are not many places these can go.
- Subtracting the dollar values from the total amounts might give you an insight about the remaining coins that must go into those rows and columns.
- With the grid filled in correctly, you now have five sets of coins labeled A-E. How can you use these coins to reach this
  puzzle's answer?
- Treat each coin as a separate connect-the-dots; draw lines from A to E for each coin.

# **Movie Reels**

- Pay attention to the letters only used once in each grid.
- The first letters of the first three answers in each reel are: 1) D, T, M; 2) A, L, V; 3) S, L, A; 4) M, A, G; 5) O, I, A

## Dartboard

- The first letter of the answer to "The Ring" goes with the 2.
- The first letter of the answer to "Pie Charts" goes with the 5.
- The first letter of the answer to "Coins" goes with the 4.
- The first letter of the answer to "Movie Reels" goes with the 15.
