Each song title and artist are synonyms (of a sort) of real songs. First step is translating the songs and titles to their real counterparts.

Either the song title or artist in each row has a number in it. Pull out that number and modify it according to the direction and number in the first column.

Map these final numbers against the letters of the alphabet, to get the final clue: DOLLYS WORKING HOURS.

The answer is "9 to 5", which is the name of a Dolly Parton song.
