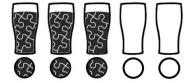

4. The Ballad of Flo and Ebb! (1/2)



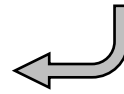
Claire and Sam were quite fond of ballads.
This was one of their favorites:

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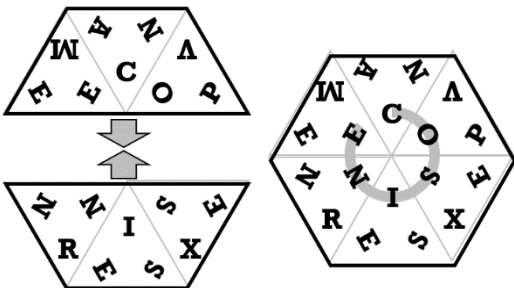
Good ol' Flo and Ebb were _____ and brother;

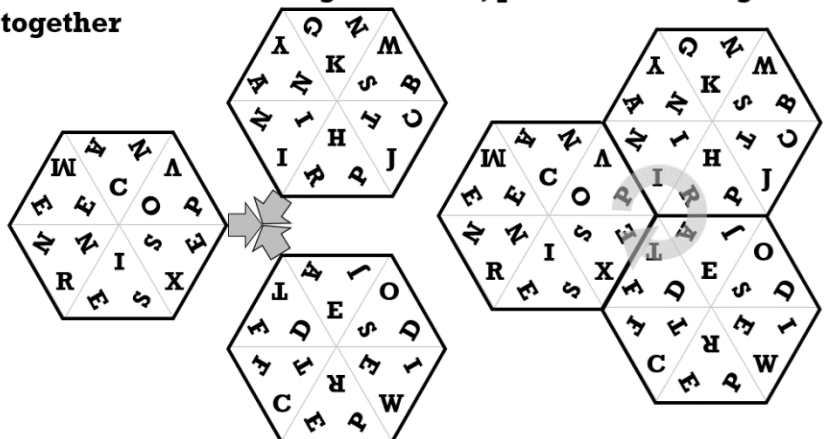
