

ASSEMBLER OF AFFIXES






While in the Kingdom of Wisdom, Milo stumbled upon a man named Gil acting rather fishy near a pond. He called out to the man to ask what he was doing.


DETAINER OF DIVERGENTS

"What are you doing?" she asked, worried about what he was cooking up.


"I was just...I wanted to eat something...different," he stuttered.

WOOER OF WORDS










META: LEARNER OF LESSONS




