

# THE MAGIC STONE



A magic stone sat at the very top of Flower Fruit Mountain, where it marinated in celestial energy for thousands of years. One fateful day, a monkey burst out of the stone! This monkey was *Sun Wukong*, who would go on to become the Monkey King. When he joined the other monkeys on Flower Fruit Mountain, they noticed how unusually powerful he was.

Monkeys often have food on their minds, but today, they're also thinking about *Sun Wukong*. Decode their conversations to figure out how they felt when they *first* saw *Sun Wukong*!



Each blank gets filled in by one of the foods listed alphabetically beneath to create a homophone/near-homophone for a word that would fit in the sentence. Then the first letters of each of these foods is strung together to give the solution: BASHFUL

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One day, Sun Wukong and his new monkey friends journeyed to the source of a stream where a powerful waterfall thundered down. The monkeys were all very curious about what was behind the waterfall, but none of them dared to venture to the other side. They declared that whoever was brave enough to go into the waterfall and strong enough to make it back out would become their new king.

Help Sun Wukong bridge the gaps in the rocks so that he can cross the waterfall and claim the title of the Monkey King! Oddly enough, to make each bridge. Sun Wukong places a single character between two adjacent rocks.

Each bridge word is made up of the final few letters of one rock and the first few letters of the next rock - with just one unused letter between: TEMPLE – LE (G) END – ENDANGER

Stringing all of these unused bridge letters together gives GO UP IN DREAD. But the answer has only six letters. If you use only the odd bridge letters, you get the final answer: GUIDED



Once he had gained many new powers, he decided he also needed a weapon. Brash and arrogant, he traveled to the palace of the Eastern Dragon King and demanded the Dragon King's finest arms and armor.

To make a **long** story **short**, *Sun Wukong* finally decided on the *Ruyi Jingu Bang*, an enormous pillar that controls the ebb and flow of the tides. *Sun Wukong* used his magic to shrink the pillar down. It **got progressively smaller** until it was the size of a needle, making it easier to carry around.

Help Sun Wukong shrink some more objects to discover a magical attribute he gained while studying with the sage!

Each word answer below is associated with a dot (short) or a dash (long). These words can then be grouped by each category and ordered by *decreasing* size ("got progressively smaller"). For example: boxing weight classes = MIDDLE>LIGHT>FEATHER) to give Morse code letters. Solution: **UNDYING**


The peaches in the heavenly orchard are special, conferring immortality on whomever eats them. There are **three types**, and they take either 3,000, 6,000, or 9,000 years to bloom. Figure out what peaches are in each of the three different groves of the orchard to find out which soldiers went after *Sun Wukong*!



The three grids at left are filled in 3's, 6's and 9's to
represent the thousands of years it took the peach
trees to bloom.

Now, note the number of leaves on the peaches (3000=0, 6000=1, 9000=2).

The lines in the grids spell out the solution from top to bottom in ternary code: **MARSHALS** 





The numbers on the outside of each grove denote the total thousands of years that it took for the peaches in that row/column/diagonal to bloom.

# THE CHALLENGE




After *Sun Wukong* ruined the celestial banquet, the emperor sent many soldiers to apprehend him. However, they were all soundly defeated. Tired of *Sun Wukong's* shenanigans, the Jade Emperor decided to appeal to a higher power for help – the Buddha.

When the Buddha arrived, he picked up *Sun Wukong* with one enormous hand and issued a challenge: if *Sun Wukong* could escape his palm, then he could have the Jade Emperor's position. If not, he would face imprisonment.

*Sun Wukong* laughed uproariously. Accepting the challenge, he bolted, traversing millions of miles in an instant. He quickly reached the end of the universe, where he saw some giant pillars.

**First**, to prove that he had made it to the edge of world, he scribbled **letter by letter** descriptions of all his past exploits, from his birth out of the magic stone to his exploits in the immortal peach orchard. When he was finally done, he took one **last** glance at the pillars.

The five solutions from the location plus the four main set puzzles (BASHFUL, GUIDED, UNDYING, HOTHEAD, MARSHALS) are written onto the columns one letter at a time, the solution appear on the first and last columns: **BUDDHAS FINGERS** 







Sun Wukong has many supernatural abilities. One interesting skill is that he can pluck out hair from his body and transform it into clones of himself! However, Sun Wukong's clones are as mischievous as he is, and today, some of them seem to be causing trouble in the garden of a minor deity.

Each number corresponds to the number of clones that Sun Wukong saw directly next to one another (i.e. In the first row, he saw 3 monkeys next to each other. After at least 1 space, he saw 3 more monkeys next to each other. And after at least 1 space, he saw a single monkey by itself.)

Help Sun Wukong **look** for his clones to find a phrase that he said to them!
