



Kalahari Down, or is it Up?



Ever the multitasking musician, Orville knows his way around several instruments, including the harmonica. Cheekily, he's left a note for his tour manager disguised within the tune transcribed below. All the voicemail contained is this ditty followed by, "Don't forget this for our show tonight! I need it to **start** confidently **with** my **new song**. Then we can **shift** into some of our old classics." This has his manager sweating – measure by measure he tries to sum up what he is supposed to extract from these notes.

Harmonica sheet music is a little different than for guitars, specifying via arrows whether to blow out or breathe in air through the instrument at different positions to make the notes.
