There is only one Hero who has the courage to confront Ganondorf and the evil he's unleashed on the Kingdom. And that Hero, Link, is you!

To restore Hyrule to order, we must meet face to face so that I can equip you with the necessary items to complete your journey. It's too dangerous to stay in one place for too long, so we must continue traveling through the Kingdom to throw Ganondorf and his minions off our trail. Follow my movements in the directions below.

- 1. Starting from Gerudo's Fortress, first you visit Hyrule Castle. The guards at both of these locations make it hard to stay around for too long, so follow me next to Goron City. I left a letter for you back at the castle, so before you finally head to Lon Lon Ranch for the night, stop back at Hyrule Castle.
- 2. Continuing in the morning, you start the days journey at Lake Hylia. This location will be important later in your main quest. Next, go straight to The Market and find an inn to stay the night.
- 3. The next day's hike begins back at Lon Lon Ranch again before returning to Hyrule Castle. From here, head directly to the Lost Woods, but be careful not to get... lost. Next, find the shortcut to Goron City, using a bomb to clear the way. From here, make your way to Zora's Domain for the night.
- 4. The final leg of your tour starts in Kakariko Village. Try not to anger the cuccos! After one last stop at Hyrule Castle, visit Lon Lon Ranch to get your horse, Epona. From here, make a final stop in the Lost Woods to visit the skull kid before returning to the Ranch for a final time. Next, visit the scientist at Lake Hylia. If there is a little time to kill, go do some fishing. Finally, Ganondorf should be off the scent and you can head to your place in Kokiri Forest.

Use the map to follow these instructions and discover in which Temple you can find me. I will be waiting, but I can't wait long. The future of Hyrule is in your hands.
