




DEADLY GAME

THE KILLER MOVE!
(Chess Piece Moves)


For those who may need a reminder of how each chess piece moves, here are diagrams that explain. Each piece can move as many times as you wish in order to collect letters along its path, as long as each move adheres to the rules for each chess piece.

KING




Each move for a KING can be one space in any direction — horizontally, vertically or diagonally.

QUEEN




Queens can also move in all directions. But, they have the power to move any number of spaces in a straight line, horizontally, vertically or diagonally.

BISHOP




Bishops can also move any number of spaces in a straight line during a move, but they can only move diagonally.

ROOK



Rooks move any number of spaces in a turn, but it must be in a straight line horizontally or vertically.

KNIGHT



Knights move in a unique manner, an L-shape, two spaces straight ahead and one space to the left or right. While all other chess pieces in this puzzle collect a letter from each piece they cross or land on to form a word, knights only collect the letter on the space they land on at the conclusion of each move. (Shown here as letter "A".) They do not collect the letters they jump over. Therefore each move the knight makes will produce one letter only.
